



Position: Communication Specialist

Description:

Duties and Responsibilities: Supports the USG, Combined Security Transition Command – Afghanistan (CSTC-A) and NATO Training Mission – Afghanistan (NTMA), mission to develop and implement a mentoring, training, and operational support capability for the Counter Narcotics Police – Afghanistan. Serves as a field mentor to provide expertise in law enforcement and communications support to operational units. The units will consist of proven individuals with the necessary skill sets to augment the enforcement efforts. The field mentors are expected to deploy and live with the operational units outside of the base, or outside of Kabul as dictated by mission requirements. The field mentors will work in a team environment to enhance the leadership skills and will also provide expert advice and operational support to their designated unit; if needed, they will be prepared to assume responsibility for multiple units. The communications specialists will provide communications services that will include de-confliction of frequencies, COMSEC, development of the Communications Electronic Operating Instruction, coordination of support assets and conducting communications checks. The communications specialists may be required to participate in the planning phase of the mission, and during enforcement operations, to create and maintain an effective communication capability.

Required Qualifications: The communication specialist will have an established background with communications systems, applicable military service and proven operational experience utilizing VHF/UHF radio and SAT systems in severe environments. Appropriate certifications of training, supporting their skill set, as well as past experience in training or mentoring of personnel is expected. Must have and demonstrate a strong proficiency in MS Office and Acrobat. Effective oral and written communication skills with all levels of the organization. Strong organizational skills with the ability to manage time and multiple priorities to completion. Must be in excellent health and be able to deploy globally to include hostile environments (Afghanistan). Work environment varies from an office setting to austere conditions. The work schedule is a 60-hour work week; however, in some high-tempo periods, extended hours may be required

Desired Qualifications: Communication Specialist who has graduated from the U.S. Army 18E Operations Communications Sergeant School, USMC Field Radio Operator Course, and/or NSW Communication representatives who have operational experience as



communication specialist/representatives preferred. Potential employee with combat experience in Operation Enduring Freedom(OEF) / Operation Iraqi Freedom (OIF) desired.
